

## Natto Makes Me Sick

Objective: To practice forming the sentence pattern using 'X makes Y Z'

Sentence: "It made him happy".

Text: Sunshine 3, Program Page 47

Time: 20 minutes

Materials: Sheet B

Summary: A pairwork activity to practice using the target sentence construction.

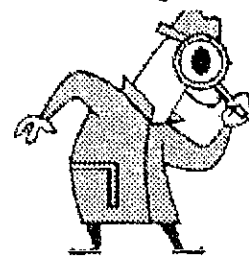
Procedure: First, discuss the various emotions such as 'happy' 'sleepy' 'angry'. This is a good opportunity to explain about the difference between 'boring' and 'bored', 'interested' or 'interesting'. This is often confused and you get many students talking about something making them 'boring'!

Hand the sheet out and ask the students to form pairs. First they choose their own secret sentence such as 'English makes me happy'. They don't show it to their friend.

They then take turns in trying to guess their friend's sentence. The friend will only tell them how many words they have got right in each guess.

For example, the student has chosen the above sentence- 'English makes me happy'. Their friend guesses 'Natto makes my brother happy'. The student has guessed 2 words in the sentence right, so the friend says '2'. However, they don't say *which* words they have got right. They keep guessing until they have the correct sentence, by which time, hopefully they have had lots of time practicing using this sentence form.
